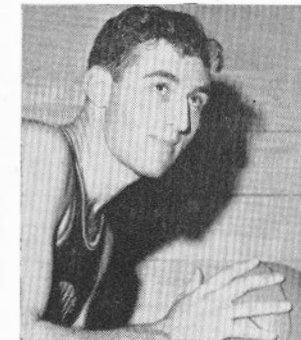

A rebroadcast of this popular WUOM series will begin on Tuesday, January 4th, at 8:15 p.m. Listeners may recall that "The Musician Comments" was originally heard on the University stations during the winter of 1952-1953. Subsequently, the series received national fame by being broadcast over 58 member stations of the National Association of Educational Broadcasters. It was also carried by several other radio stations in Michigan.

"The Musician Comments" brings to the microphone on each program one outstanding member of the University of Michigan School of Music faculty. Informally, the musician speaks about his particular interest in music, using appropriate recorded excerpts as illustrations. We hope you'll again enjoy hearing these entertaining, often amusing chats which take you behind the scenes in the working world of music.

THE BAROQUE TRIO

Music of the 17th and 18th centuries written for flute, oboe and harpsichord will be performed by the Baroque Trio in a series of four Tuesday evening STUDIO SHOWCASE programs, on January 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th, at 7 o'clock p.m. The members of the Baroque Trio, who are all on the faculty of the University of Michigan School of Music, are: Nelson Hauenstein, flute; Florian Mueller, oboe; and Marilyn Mason, harpsichord.

Nelson Hauenstein, Instructor in Flute, received his musical training at the Eastman School of Music, and after serving in the Armed Forces, joined the faculty of the University.

Florian Mueller was for 25 years the first oboist of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. He joins the University School of Music this year as Lecturer in Oboe and Wind Instruments.

Marilyn Mason, Assistant Professor of Organ, received her musical training at the University of Michigan with the late Palmer Christian and in France with Nadia Boulanger.

The Baroque Trio will be sponsored by the University of Michigan Extension Service for concerts throughout the state.
