FLOURISH AND FUGUE \*\* (1959) John Cook

John Cook, English born, is organist and choirmaster of St. Paul's Cathedral, London, Ontario. This work was written for the State Trumpet at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine.

MINIATURE \*\* (1958) Jean Langlais

This work, in three part form, employs various flute registers of the organ.
