## Marilyn Mason

Marilyn Mason is Chairman of the Department of Organ of the University of Michigan. She has been guest Professor at Columbia University, and also at Union Theological Seminary where she received the Doctorate of Sacred Music degree in 1954. She has been heard in recitals throughout North America and Europe. Dr. Mason was the first American woman to play in Westminster Abbey, when she represented the United States at the International Congress of Organists in 1957. Subsequent tours of England and the Continent have included a return engagement at Westminster Abbey and appearances in Vienna, and Berlin. The summer of 1960 she played four concerts at the Auditorio Nacional in Mexico City, being the first woman organist to play in Latin America. She has a special interest in contemporary music, and has commissioned many composers to write for the organ.



## Organ Recital

## Program

Martini, commonly called "Padre Martini", was chapel master of the Church of San Francesca at Bologna.

Fantasia and Fugue in G minor, BWV 542 . . . Johann Sebastian Bach 1685–1750

This composition dates from Bach's late Weimar period. The boldness and inventiveness of the harmonic progressions anticipate the late Romantic period. Bach first played this great work on a visit to Hamburg where he competed for the position of organist at the Jacobi Church.

#### INTERMISSION

Pastorale . . . . . . . . . . . . Jean-Jules Roger-Ducasse 1873-1954

The Pastorale for organ, written in 1909, is dedicated to Mlle. Nadia Boulanger and was given the first performance April 20, 1910, by Alexandre Guilmant. It is a work of charming and graceful construction, and the reflective mood which pervades throughout captivates irresistibly . . . The sonority attained through the registration, the various canons (in two, three, and four parts, distributed among the manuals in different rhythms), and the organistic writing, are all exquisite. The end, with its attenuated feeling, is of exceeding beauty. One regrets this charming Pastorale is almost inaccessible because of its difficulty of execution, the intricate writing, and the registrational demands, to which many instruments cannot do justice. CAROL PRELUDE on Greensleeves (1950) . . . . . . . Searle Wright

The composer of this charming work is organist and choirmaster of St. Paul's
Chapel, Columbia University, in New York City.

#### MARILYN MASON

Chairman of the Organ Department at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, Dr. Mason has appeared in recitals throughout North America and Europe. In 1957 she was accorded the distinction of being the first American woman to perform in Westminster Abbey when she represented the United States at the International Congress of Organists. Subsequent tours to England and the Continent have included appearances in Vienna, Berlin, Haarlem, Edinburgh, Liverpool, and Stratford-on-Avon. For this occasion, Dr. Mason comes to Worcester directly from London where she played once again at Westminster Abbey, and at Royal Festival Hall.

#### MUSIC AT FIRST BAPTIST 65/66

The next event in this series will be Sunday evening, November 28, at 7:30 o'clock, when the Oratorio Choir of Asylum Hill Congregational Church in Hartford, will join with the Chancel Choir of First Baptist Church and the Choir of Men and Boys of All Saints Church in Worcester, assisted by the Easttern Nazarene College Brass Ensemble, to present a concert of music for choirs, organ, and brass, by Giovanni Gabrieli, Johann Sebastian Bach, and Jean Langlais. This program will be held in All Saints Church, Worcester.
