CELIA MAE BRYANT



President, Music Teachers National Association is well known as a teacher, performer, writer, lecturer and adjudicator, is Professor of Music at the University of Oklahoma. She has been a member of the faculty since 1948. She has given numerous piano ses-

sions and recitals over the country, particularly at colleges, universities and State Conventions of Music Teachers Associations. She was recently selected for the 1970 publication of "The Two Thousand Women of Achievement" by Kay, Sons and Daughter, Ltd. of London, England, publishers of international biographical reference works.



MARILYN MASON

Professor of Music and Chairman of the Organ Department at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. She has been guest professor at Columbia University and also at the Union Theological Seminary, where she received the Doctor of Sacred Music degree in 1954. Dr. Mason has been heard in re-

citals in Europe and throughout North and South America. She was the first American woman to play in Westminster Abbey when she represented the United States at the International Congress of Organists in 1957. Because of her interest in contemporary music Dr. Mason has commissioned numerous composers to write for the organ and has given many premier performances.
