MARILYN MASON

Marilyn Mason is Professor of Music and Chairman of the Organ Department at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. A native of Oklahoma, she holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees from the University of Michigan and the Doctor of Sacred Music degree from Union Theological Seminary in New York.

Dr. Mason is one of America's foremost organ recitalists. Her recital tours have taken her to all parts of America, as well as to Europe, Mexico, South America, and Egypt. She has played twice for the International Congress of Organists and at many regional and national conventions of the American Guild of Organists. She has commissioned many composers to write for the organ, and her recitals have included a number of premiere performances.

In addition to her recital appearances, Dr. Mason is an active teacher. She conducts many workshops each year, and is equally at home with either the beginning church organist or the advanced graduate student.

Dr. Mason's classes will include instruction in basic organ technique and repertoire and service playing, as well as repertoire and interpretation for the more advanced player.

DONALD L. NEUEN

Donald L. Neuen is Director of Choral Activities and Professor of Music at The University of Tennessee, Knoxville. Until recently he was Assistant Conductor and Director of Choral Activities for the Atlanta Symphony, and Director of Orchestral and Choral Activities at Georgia State University. Prior to that he held similar positions at Ball State University, Muncie, Indiana, and at the University of Wisconsin at Madison. He has also been conductor of the Indianapolis Symphony Chorus, a member of the Robert Shaw Chorale, and a conducting student of Julius Herford at Indiana University. In 1972 Mr. Neuen received the Outstanding Alumnus Award from Ball State University School of Music.
