FRANK BUTLER CAMPBELL

Honoring sixty years of loyal distinguished service as organist of the First Presbyterian Church of Caro, Michigan. A member of the American Guild of Organists and a stalwart of the Church. Presented in his presence this sixth day of October, 1974 by the Session and members of the Congregation.

A wall plaque, cast in bronze, and bearing this inscription, will be delivered to the church by the Californian manufacturer in about four weeks, and will be affixed to the wall by the organ console.

Mr. Frank B. Campbell became the organist of this church in the fall of 1914. His musical training began when his mother taught him piano, and continued under the guidance and inspiration of John C. Cummings of Saginaw. H. R. Evans of Bay City, a former faculty member of the University School of Music in Ann Arbor, a composer and organist of note, influenced the young Mr. Campbell to such a degree that Frank began to study organ under Palmer Christian, and harmony theory under Otto Stahl at the University of Michigan. The study of theory and harmony under the tuition of Otto Stahl was of prime importance to Frank, but of greater importance was the study of organ under Palmer Christian, and the friendship that developed between them. It is interesting to note that our guest organist for this special occasion, Dr. Marilyn Mason, is also a protege of Palmer Christian.

The ministry of music which Frank Campbell has given to the Caro Presbyterian Church, to the community, and to music lovers in this entire area has placed us all in his debt. As we celebrate the diamond jubilee of his acceptance of the position of church organist in Caro, we thank him for his dedication to the Church and for his equal dedication to the weekly services of worship as in and through the works of the great classical composers, and the rich treasure of Christian praise, we have been brought into the presence of God by his talent and skill.

Service such as has been given to us by Mr. Campbell involves sacrifice, and not the least, the sacrifice of many hours of family and married life. We thank Veva his wife, and we thank his two daughters and his son for the support they have given to him in the sixty years of his marriage to the music of the church, and we pray God's continued blessing upon them and upon their combined family life.
