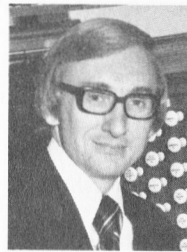

William Herring has been music director at Saint Peters since 1971. He studied music at the Cleveland Institute of Music, the University of Windsor, Duquesne University and the University of Pittsburgh.

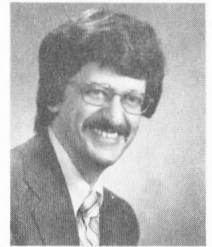
Prior to coming to Erie he held positions at St. Thomas Church Cleveland, Ohio; St. Sebastian Church and Holy Innocents Church in Pittsburgh.

Besides his duties here at the Cathedral he is Executive Director of the Liturgical Commission for the Diocese of Erie and is on the Executive Board for the National Association of Cathedral Organists.

In the past he has served on the Commissions Committee for the Composers' Forum, and on the advisory board for the music in the new Sacramentary. Served on the music faculty at Mercyhurst College for two years.

He has published a booklet entitled *The Role of Music in the New Rite of the Roman Liturgy* which is now in its fourth printing by the American Catholic Press.

Mr. Herring will be presenting an organ recital April 11 as Artist-in-Residence for Gannon College here at the Cathedral.
