

MARILYN MASON is University Organist and Chairman of the Organ Department at the University of Michigan. In her Michigan student days she was a student of Palmer Christian. She attended Union Theological Seminary, where she earned the degree of Sacred Music. She was the first American woman to play in Westminster Abbey, the first woman organist to play in Latin America, and the first American organist to play in Egypt. Numerous invitations have

taken her to five continents: North and South America, Europe, Africa, and Australia. She has served as adjudicator at almost every major competition in the world; her own repertoire is immense, covering every period of literature. Her performances are noted for their "vitality, great sweep and kaleidoscope registrations." Few people can be compared to her extensive artistic achievements as recitalist, teacher, judge and recorder. In further contributions to her profession, she has commissioned over thirty works by contemporary American composers, each dedicated to her and premiered by her.

At Ashland College he studied organ with the late Mabel Zehner and piano with Elizabeth Pastor. He received the Master of Sacred Music degree from the

Mr. Gilbert has played recitals throughout Ohio and in New York City. He will tour Europe for the third time with the Ashland College Choir in late May and June of this year.
