THE SCHOOL OF NURSING

Founded one hundred years ago, the School of Nursing operated under various auspices until 1941, when it became a separate teaching unit within the University. The four-year program leading to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree was established in 1952. In 1971 registered nurses were admitted to the baccalaureate program on the Ann Arbor campus for the first time. The Flint program for registered nurses opened in 1975, and in 1976 the community-based programs for registered nurses in Kalamazoo and Traverse City were established.

The Master's programs in Psychiatric/Mental Health and Medical-Surgical Nursing were established in 1961 and 1962 respectively, followed by Parent-Child Nursing in 1975 and Community Health Nursing in 1977. The first class in the Master's Program in Gerontological Nursing entered in the fall of 1987; the Nursing Administration program admitted its first students in September 1989, and its first students in the dual-degree Master's program in Nursing Administration and Business Administration in September 1990. At the Doctoral level, in 1975 The University of Michigan was one of the first schools in the country to offer the Ph.D. degree in Nursing.

All the School of Nursing's alumni can be proud of the tradition of excellence which has prevailed throughout the School's history.
