

Tapani Yrjölä is a Finnish concert violinist and educator who performs widely in Europe and the United States, being known especially for the performance of the complete solo violin music of J.S. Bach. He is a professor of music in Finland at Joensuu Conservatory and in that capacity maintains a full schedule of concerts, recordings, and European engagements.

Dr. Yrjölä was the first Finnish string player to earn a Doctorate in performance, having received that degree from The University of Michigan in 1990, from which school he also holds the Master's degree in violin performance.

He has been the recipient of numerous awards, including those from the Finlandia Foundation, The Finnish Cultural Foundation, as well as having been named a Sibelius Scholar.

Dr. Yrjölä performs on a Guarneri model violin especially built for him in 1989 by Joseph Curton and Greg Alf of Ann Arbor.

Marilyn Mason is university organist and chairman of the Organ Department of the University of Michigan. She was the first woman to play in Westminster Abbey, the first woman organist to perform in Latin America, and the first American to perform in Egypt. She was chosen 1988 Performer of the Year by the New York Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Her discography includes music of Bach, Handel, Mondonville, and contemporary composers on Columbia and Musical Heritage Society labels.
